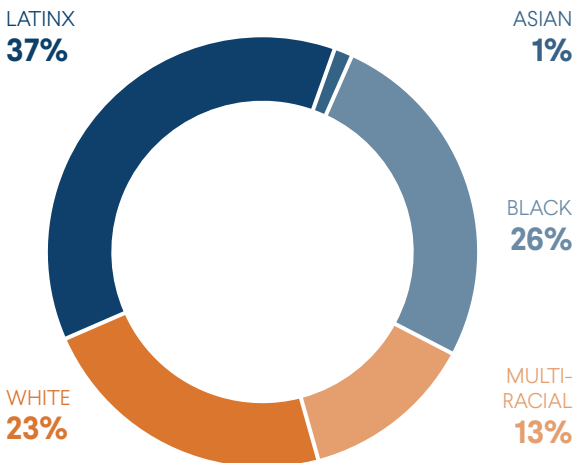

## SPONSOR STATEMENT
