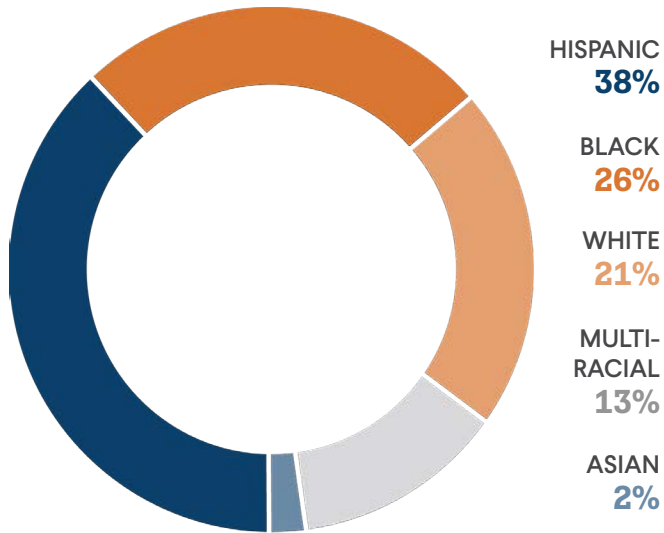

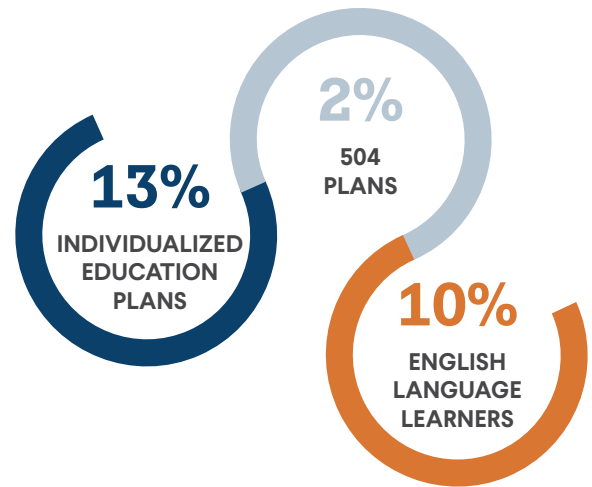

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS



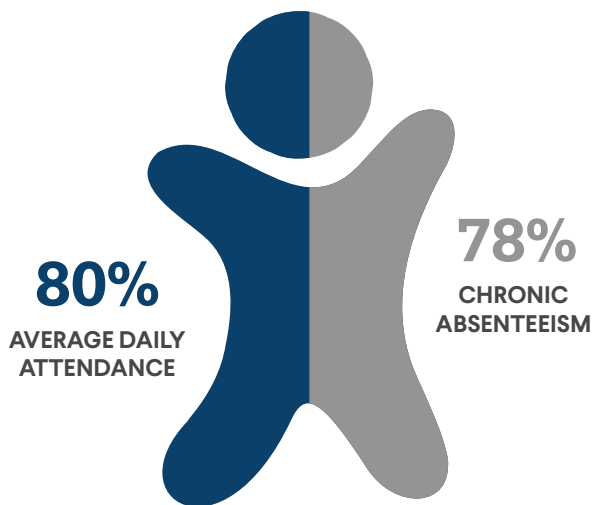

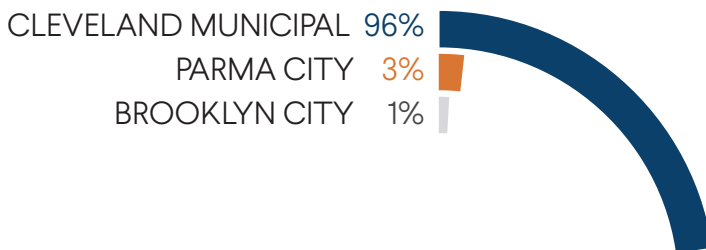

- 100% of students met the state reading requirements for promotion to Grade 4

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

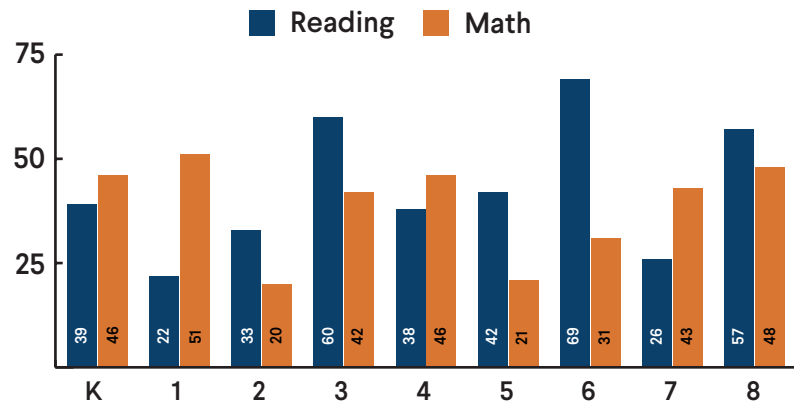
The academic goals of West Park Academy during the 2021-22 school year were:

- 75% of students will improve grade level appropriate reading skills
- 50% of English Language Learners (ELL) will grow by one designation on the OELPA
- Decrease the number of suspensions by up to 10%

Emerging from the pandemic, West Park Academy met all goals. 76% of students made improvement in reading according to i-Ready assessment (Fall 2021 to Spring 2022). ELL students exceeded their Gap Closing goal by five percent on the state assessment. West Park administration decreased the number of suspensions by 5%. As an additional success, 100% of students met the state reading requirements for promotion to Grade 4.
